## Summer Re-creation

Most people consider summer a prime time to relax, recharge and enjoy. This summer, Siesta Key Chapel offered something more, something better! It offered folks an opportunity to follow Christ’s call to “find ourselves” by “losing ourselves” in service to others.

**For teens**, summer included sloshing through a West Virginia family’s smelly, disgusting waterlogged basement in flood recovery efforts with other kids from Peace River Presbytery. It involved clearing away debris from a demolished concrete shower stall that once housed a homeless migrant worker in Wimauma, sorting through mountains of canned food goods for *Metropolitan Ministries* in Tampa, and emptying a trailer full of medical supplies under the scorching Florida sun. For one of our teens, summer meant a month working 12-hour days scrubbing pots and pans in a steam-filled, greasy camp kitchen at *Southwind*.

Not to be outdone, a group of **adults from the Chapel** traveled to the poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere, Haiti, to lead a week of Bible school. That is no small matter in a country where 1 in 5 dies before their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday.

**Why in the world did they do it?** Why in the world did they go? Because our Lord called each and every one of us to be about our “Father’s business” -- proclaiming good news, making disciples, feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, and so much more. May God give YOU a clear sense of your calling as we say *good-bye* to summer and *hello* to another year.

## Ask a Nurse

Ask-a-Nurse



Welcome to the first "Ask-a-Nurse" column. As a number of you are aware, I promised a venue where I could share your questions. So keep the questions coming, you can call me at church, leave me a note, or stop me when you see me. I will answer one or two questions in each newsletter.

- Q. The first question I received was, "What is MRSA? Where does it come from? How is it treated?"
- A. MRSA is the abbreviation for Methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus, a gram-positive bacteria

Staph aureus can coexist in the community on your skin and in your nose without causing infection. Over 2 million people in the United States have been identified as having this bacteria present on or in their body.

Staph aureus was first discovered in 1880. It has been identified as the culprit in causing many cases of pneumonia, urinary tract infections, and surgical site infections. These infections were successfully treated with penicillin until 1961, when the bacteria became stronger than the medication. Today new antibiotics such as Cleocin, Vancomycin, and Bactrim are effective in killing the bacteria.

The best way to prevent a staphylococcus infection is to **WASH YOUR HANDS**. Washing for 15 seconds with soap and water at least seven times a day is recommended. (Source: Dallas Medical Center: Infection Control)

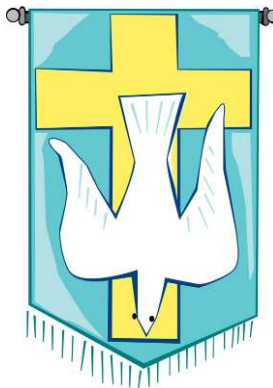
Booker Middle School is the **Visual & Performing Arts** middle school magnet program in Sarasota County.

Under Mr. Bzenas's guidance, the TV/film production program has been revitalized with state of the art digital equipment, the dance studio has been renovated to accommodate more students, drama and theatre have been provided a remodeled studio space, and the graphic design computer laboratory has been relocated and updated. In addition, the creative writing, orchestra, jazz band and chorus departments have all been recognized for their outstanding community service productions.



The school has successfully been awarded several grants including funds for a world drums program and an arts integration pilot project, which will begin this fall. Booker Middle School was also recognized in 2007 as a **Creative Ticket School of Excellence** by the *Florida Alliance for Arts Education*.

### Siesta Key Chapel Chicken Salad

1 Chicken, roasted, meat pulled into bite size pieces (Make it easy on yourself and go to Publix or Sam's and buy one that is already roasted!)

1 Small, Vidalia, Maui, or other sweet onion, small dice

2 Stalks Celery, small dice

1 tsp. Celery Salt

2 Tbs. Dijon Mustard

1 Cup Mayonnaise (You may need more)

1 Cup Seedless Grapes, cut in half

Salt and pepper to taste

#### Method:

Gently mix all of the ingredients together, except the grapes, being careful not to break up the chicken.

Taste, and adjust seasoning. You may want to add more mayonnaise if the mixture is dry.

Fold in the grapes, and place in a plastic container, cover and refrigerate.

For best results, make the salad while the chicken is still warm. Make it the day before so that the flavors have a chance to blend. Then enjoy!

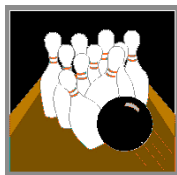

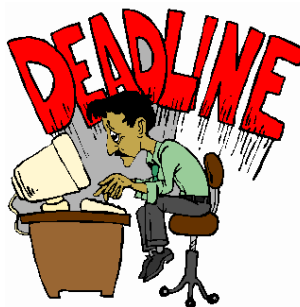

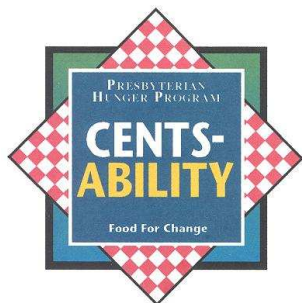
The Building and Grounds Committee will reconvene in September, but will not meet, officially, until October. During the summer, many improvements and repairs were completed by our custodian, committee members, and/or contractors. They include:

1. All carpets, rugs, runners and walk-off mats were cleaned.
2. Our trees and palms had a “Hurricane Cut”, and many lower limbs were removed for beautification.
3. Roofs and eaves were cleared of debris and leaves.
4. Flooring in the restrooms and kitchen, and all vinyl floors were stripped, scrubbed, and waxed.
5. Ann Blechta worked “Yeoman Duty” to keep our plantings alive this summer, without the aid of the irrigation system.
6. The women of the Chapel cleaned, scrubbed, and organized the Fellowship Hall kitchen.
7. Vertical blinds have been installed in the remodeled music room and office.
8. A rear closet in the sanctuary was organized to store material for the ushers and worship.
9. New seat cushions to replace broken or soiled cushions in the Fellowship Hall Meeting Room were ordered.
10. The grounds were completely treated for fire ants.

As soon as our construction project is complete (and it is not only turning out to be a beautiful addition, but a very functional one), the following projects will be implemented:

1. The windows of all buildings will be professionally cleaned, inside and out.
2. Driveways will be graded and re-stoned.
3. Our plan for the re-establishment of our “Wilsen Well” irrigation system will be completed.
4. New wood signs for our buildings have been ordered and will be installed in the fall.

## Cents-Ability



One of the great difficulties we encounter in dealing with problems like hunger is that they are so immense and seem unending; hunger has so many roots and ramifications that we don't know where to begin. We become depressed; we

begin to feel that nothing and nobody – even God – can possibly provide solutions to problems like hunger. Trusting in God, we do not need to let our anxiety become despair. Relying on God's guidance, we can look for the "handle" which seems to fit our hand. Using God's strength, we can begin to cut out the root that is nearest us.

The **Cents-Ability** program is one of the ways we can root out hunger close to us – 50% of the money will be used here in our region to help support programs ministering the needs of our neighbors. Another 50% will be disbursed nationally and internationally to organizations or agencies evaluated and approved by the Advisory Committee of the Presbyterian Hunger Program.

Resolve to be faithful to God's call and a long term commitment to help others, each day... each meal. Drop your change into a container, and bring it to the sanctuary on the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month, e.g. August 31 and November 30 for 2008. You will be happy you did.

## Sun Trust Bank Promotion My Cause Will Donate to SKC!



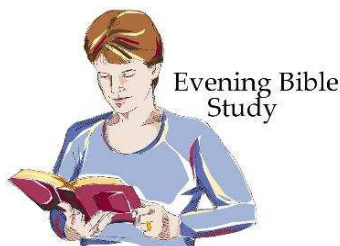
